
The medical profession is based on the principle: "First, do no harm" – *Primum non nocere*. Yet, startling numbers of errors keep occurring globally, in hospital care environments: 134 million Adverse Events in Low and Middle Income Countries alone, 2.6 million deaths, 15% of hospital expenses, 40% of Primary care patients ...

To tackle these issues head on with a renewed focus, World Health Organisation (WHO) has initiated the annual observance of World Patient Safety Day (WPSD), on 17th September.
